PRINCIPALS REPORT

Parent teacher interviews and student reports

We have finished our parents and teacher interviews. We had a great response with almost 100% of families engaging in discussions with teachers about the progress of their children. Some initial feedback on our adjusted reports has also been positive. Our Department of Education curriculum teams have been working on how we report to parents for a while now and we should see some new direction on how we report, in response to the curriculum review newly completed. Project Based Learning is back

This term has seen the return of PBL taking centre stage in classrooms. Last term a large number of students were asking about when PBL would be returning as a feature of our school curriculum happy to say we are back on track with our PBL focus. The initial stage in PBL is the Hook Event and developing the Driving Question (DQ). The DQs for each stage are refined and then the students begin to unpack what they Need To Know in order to address the DQ. This is where they might contact an expert to learn more about a subject of interest. We have already tapped into the expertise of some of our families for the Hook Event and some of you may be asked to offer help as an expert. This week a number of Hook Events were held and the DQs developed. Teachers will be using Seesaw and Twitter to keep you up to speed with what is happening. We realise our ability to communicate and involve families has been significantly impacted by COVID 19 this year but we will do our best to keep you informed. You may be seeing more indepth class information from teachers via Seesaw as a way to help you know what the class and your child are learning about or doing.

School uniforms

There has been a great response from students and families about the school uniform. We are seeing a lot more children wearing the full school uniform each day. We are reminding children to wear a school skort with stockings, shorts or pants rather than leggings. If you can encourage your children to do so that would be most appreciated.

Kindergarten transition

We are enrolling for kindergarten now and would like to have all enrolments in by the end of Term 3. This helps us with planning for classes. Currently we have been advised that our usual Term 3 Parent Information session cannot be held this term. We will plan to have an information session in Term 4 instead. If social distancing is still an issue this session may be offered via Zoom. For general enquiries about the Kindergarten enrolment please visit our website or call the school office. To ensure all students get their orders and that the correct payment is received, it is recommended that families use the **Scholastic LOOP system**. Families can pay online and the order will go directly to Scholastic. The orders are then delivered to school for free.

For those who pay by cash, **PLEASE** ensure you have the correct money and that the envelope is securely sealed. This makes it a lot smoother to process all orders and ensures the order can be submitted to Scholastic as soon as possible.

If you miss the cut-off date, don't worry, you can still order books through the LOOP system. They will be delivered to your house instead of school for a small fee and 10% of your order still goes back to the school in Scholastic Rewards. We must have a cut-off date for books to be delivered to school so children don't miss out on popular books. Also, Scholastic charges the school postage costs if we keep the orders open and they have to send books after the initial cut-off date.


